### LEARNING OBJECTIVES:

This program has been designed to provide Obstetrician/Gynecologists with information on current standards and new technologies in the diagnosis and treatment of diseases and conditions in the field of Women's Health Care including Obstetrics, Reproductive Endocrinology, Gynecology, Gynecologic Oncology and Pelvic Surgery, and to update physicians on national and local health care legislation and trends affecting medical practice. At the conclusion of this program, the participant will be able to:

- Discuss the role of the primary care physician in screening and management of lipid profiles in female patients, know how to read a lipid panel and interpret normal and abnormal values and how to counsel and treat or refer patients with abnormal profiles.
- Describe appropriate indications for selective immunizations, identify barriers to implementing vaccines, and address concerns about vaccine safety with patients. Encourage colleagues to be advocates for vaccinations in their practices.
- Incorporate the new 3 tiered FHR classification system into practice and appreciate the importance of all providers using the same classification system for communication purposes; and for Category III, correct or deliver expeditiously.
- Consider minimum documentation for diagnosis and follow up for women with pelvic pain, identify common gynecologic diagnoses and their limitations. Describe less common causes of pelvic pain and their treatments.
- Identify differences between female and male sexual response, and define and clarify female sexual dysfunction; define benefits of a treatment platform.
- Express greater appreciation and understanding of the legislative process nationally, and obtain a glimpse of the politics in Washington DC as seen through the eyes of a "novice"
- Analyze the numerous habits and states that can adversely affect health and happiness
- Know the consequences of adolescent sexual activity and describe measures for risk reduction
- Identify the issues creating risk and liability for Ob/Gyn physicians and describe strategies to mitigate the risk
- Describe complications of influenza during pregnancy and postpartum and review treatment recommendations for influenza. Understand vaccine recommendations, risks, and effectiveness.
- Outline therapies for refractory overactive bladder and describe therapy limitations in overactive bladder.
- Identify areas of mutual cooperative liaison between the Texas Medical Association and Ob/Gyn physicians in Texas and discuss how we can partner together to achieve better healthcare for women patients in Texas.
